A three-year-old who likes to read and can read on the first grade level!

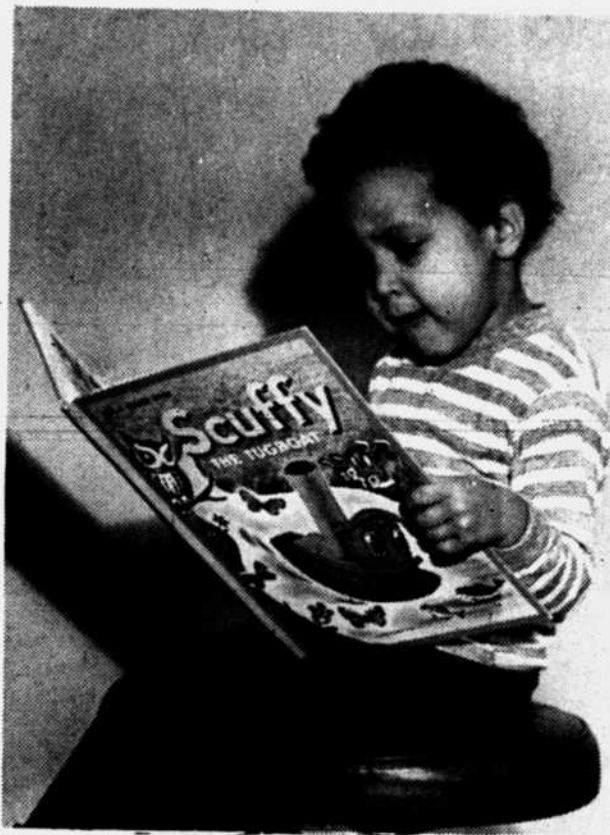
A bit unusual!
