### Building Project Staff

A Durham native, Arthur John Clemment, has been appointed Assistant to the Project Manager of the \$46.5 million Ochsner Medical Center expansion and remodeling project in New Orleans.

Clemment, a son of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Clement of 206 Pekoe Street, is associated with Heering and Heering Company, an Atlanta-based architectural and construction management firm.

Heering and Heering is one of the south's major architectural and construction firms. In addition to the Ochsner project, the firm designed the Atlanta Stadium, Cincinnati's Riverfront Stadium

and the new Rich Stadium in Buffalo, New York.

The massive Ochsner Medical Center project, which includes construction of eight major elements and renovation of about half of the existing structure, has a target completion date of late 1977.

Clemment is a 1971 graduate of the North Carolina State University School of Design and received his masters degree in architecture from Massachusetts Institute of Technology. While a student at NCSU, Clemment was a summer employee of John D. Latimer and Associates of Durham.

Registration for the Charlotte-Mecklenburg School's 1975 regular secondary summer schools will be Monday, June 16, at Garinger High School for students who have not registered.

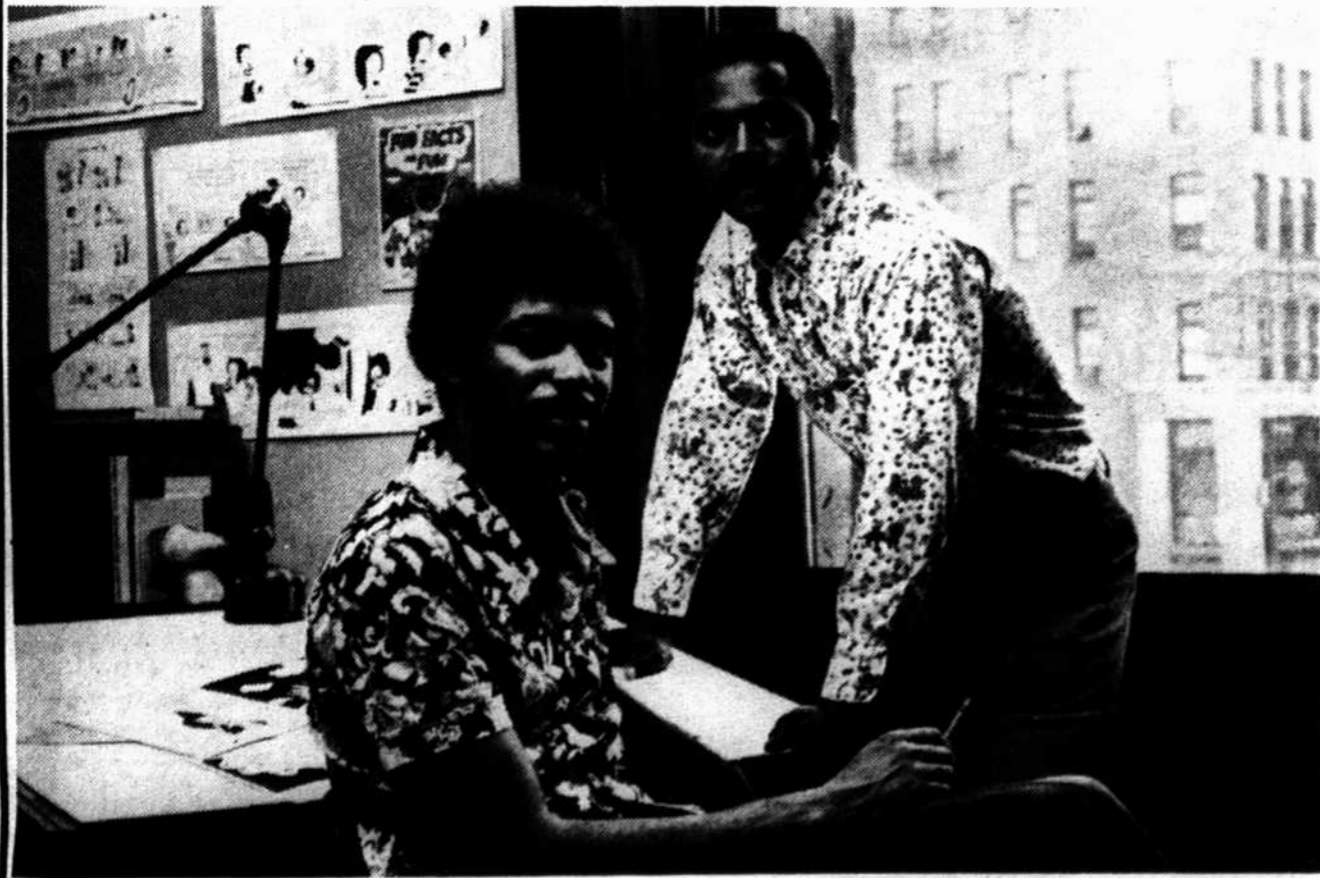

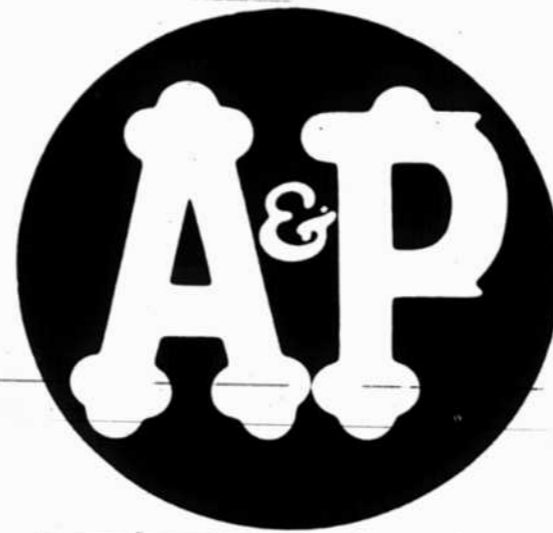
