Black Movie, TV News Briefs

"Let's Do It Again," "Mahogany" Running Strong In Nation's 50 Top Grossing Films

Those two blockbuster movies, "Mahogany" and "Let's Do It Again" are still running neck and neck in the "50 Top-Grossing Films" list. In the week ending Oct. 29, "Mahogany" had pulled to No. 2, "Let's Do It Again" was No. 3 and "Three Days of the Condor" was No. 1. But the totals grossed showed "Mahogany" in 42 theatres with \$1,457,629 and "Let's Do It Again" in 45 theatres with \$2,074,289.

Lu Horne, director of International Television Productions for the Children's Television Workshop ("Sesame Street" and "The Electric Company") spends about one-third of his working days traveling abroad, helping to develop variations of the shows there. This week he's off to Holland, Germany, Paris and Madrid. Former Hampton Institute Communications professor is one of the highest positioned black executives in TV industry.

International Telephone and Telegraph Corporation (ITT), sponsor of "Big Blue Marble," will present the award-winning series worldwide next year. The international roll-out currently is slated for Hong Kong, Malaysia, Greece, Canada, West Germany, Austria, Kenya, Switzerland, West Nigeria, North Nigeria, Oman, Zambia, Cyprus, Malta and Rhodesia. The series will be translated into German, Portuguese, Arabic, Spanish and French.

"Sesame Street's" seventh season, to begin Dec. 1, consists of 130 hour-long episodes, some of which will feature programs crated in New Mexico, including a visit to the 600-year-old Taos Indian Pueblo with singer-composer Buffy St. Marie, who will also be a regular guest performer on the street this season.

Comedian Nipsey Russell maintains his New York base at the Henry Hudson Hotel and

commutes to Hollywood weekly to tape the "Match Game" TV shows he's seen on daily and other shows such as "Rhyme and Reason" on which he'll be seen Nov. 13.

New York Knicks star Bill Bradley is one of the producers of "The Poison Tree," now in rehearsals for a Jan. 15 bow on Broadway. The play, which uses a prison setting as a metaphor for the world outside has a cast including Cleavon Little, Moses Gunn, Dick Williams and Peter Master-son.

Fann ineatrical ensemble act in virtually every movie filmed in NYC and nine of Fann's top proteges made the scene on the very first day of shooting of Paramount's "The Marathon Man."
