Elderly Persons To Get

Special Tax Exemption

Elderly and disabled Mecklenburg County citizens can get up to a \$5,000 exemption on their property taxes if they earn \$7,500 a year or less.

To get the exemption, an elderly person must fill out a special application for the exemption each year. This application can be obtained by calling the County Tax Supervisor's Office, 720 East Fourth Street. The application can then be returned to the supervisor's office by mail since construction work in the area makes parking a problem.

Persons under 65 years old must get a certification from a doctor saying the person is totally and permanently disabled to qualify for an exemption. Certification from Social Security or the Veterans Administration is not enough.

The fund raising project was begun in October of 1975.

NOTICE is hereby given that public hearings will be held by the City Council and the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission in the Board Meeting Room on the Fourth Floor of the Education Center at 701 East Second Street beginning at 7:30 o'clock P.M. on Monday, the 19th day of January, 1976, on the following petitions proposing changes on the Official Zoning Maps of the City of Charlotte, N.C.:

PETITION NO. 76-1. Change from R-6MF to O-6(CD) property fronting 100 feet on the westerly side of Pinoka Street, located 190 feet on the northeasterly side of the intersection of Pinoka Street and Hovis Road. Petitioner: George H. Robinson.

PETITION NO. 76-2. Consideration of an amendment to the zoning ordinance in regard to height requirements for radio and television masts and a provision for those stations. Petitioner: Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission.

PETITION NO. 76-4. Consider granting conditional approval for additional construction to Y.W.C.A. facility in an

R-9 district. 9.65 acres fronting 349.6 feet on the westerly side of Park Road and Townes Road. Petitioner: Young Women's Christian Association.

PETITION NO. 76-5 Change from R-9 to B-1 property fronting in the south side of Central Avenue and the southeast corner of the intersection of Central Avenue and Winterfield Place. Petitioner: Jimmie Pourlos.

PETITION NO. 76-6 Change from R-9 to b-1 and O-15 property fronting on the south side of Tuckaseegee Road directly south of Edgewood Drive and extending west about 840 feet. Petitioner: Reginald S. Hamel.

The City Council may change the existing zoning classification of the entire area covered by each petition, or any part or parts of such area, to the classification requested, or to a higher classification or classifications without the necessity of withdrawal or modification of the petition.

Parties in interest and citizens shall have an opportunity to be heard and may obtain further information on the proposed change from the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission Office, Cameron Brown Building, 301 South McDowell Street.

Anyone desiring to file a written petition of protest intended to invoke the 3/4 majority vote rule as specified in G.S. 160A-385 must file such petition in the Office of the City Clerk not later than the close of business on January 14, 1976.
