## **Elderly Persons To Get Special Tax Exemption**

Elderly and diabled Mecklenburg County citizens can get up to a \$5,000 exemption on their property taxes if they earn \$7,500 a year or less.

To get the exemption, an elderly person must fill out a special application for the exemption each year. This application can be obtained by calling the County Tax Supervisor's Office, 720 East Fourth Street: The application can then be returned to the supervisor's office by mail since construction work in the area makes parking a problem.

Persons under 65 years old must get a certification from a doctor saying the person is totally and permanently disabled to qualify for an exemption. Certification from Social Secruity or the Veterans

administration is not enough.


