The kind of recipe that might be selected is Stack-A-Biscuit Stroganoff. Ground beef makes for hearty eating at a reasonable price. The touch that turns this into a dish you might serve for com-

pany is the topping of the flaky biscuit halves, glazed a golden brown and richly flavored from a baked-on sour cream topping.

Raleigh .... A Prayer for Judgment Continued (PJC) may no longer save your driver's license according to Edward L. Powell, Commissioner of Motor Vehicles. Powell announced today

that a new law, effective January 1, 1976, provides that a third or subsequent PJC received within a five-year period constitutes a final conviction and all PJC's must be reported by the courts to the North Carolina Division of Motor Vehicles.

The new law which applies to all Prayers for Judgment Continued in traffic cases which are entered after January 1, 1976 was enacted by the 1975 General Assembly.

Commissioner Powell said, 'This law can greatly aid our efforts in traffic safety. Prior to the passage of this Act, a sizeable number of drivers were avoiding convictons on their records by obtaining a

# **For Seven Optional Schools**

Applications are now being accepted for enrollment next year in all Charlotte-Mecklenburg optional schools including a proposed grade one through nine traditional program to be located at Northwest Junior High.

Applications will be made on the 1976-77 "Request for Reassignment" form, often referred to as the "blue form" Persons interested in making an application can pick up the form at any school or at the Education Center, 701 E. Second St.

The form should be filled out and returned to the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools' Pupil Assignment Office in the Education Center (P.O. Box 149, Charlotte, NC 28230) by Feb.

Optional schools for which applications are being accepted are Elizabeth Open Elementary (1-6), Irwin Avenue Open Elementary (1-6), Meyers Park Traditional Elementary, (1-6), Piedmont Open Middle (7-9), and the open component at West Charlotte High School (10-12). In addition, applications are being accepted for the proposed traditional program to be located

at the present Northwest Junior High site, 1415 Beatties Ford Rd. School officials point out

that a final decision to convert Northwest to a traditional elementary junior high school (grades one through nine) will be made after a study of the applications received. According to board of education action on Dec. 9, 1975, the board's Program Services Committee will study the results of applications and make recommendations at the first board meeting in March.




