New Subdivision

John Crosland Homes broke ground for a new subdivision, known as Chestnut Lake and located on Lawyers Road, just east of Albemarle Road.

Involving 118 acres of heavily wooded terrain, the new project will consist of approximately 315 total units - 285 two, three and four bedroom single family homes in the \$35,000 to \$45,000 price range and 30 two and three bedroom duplexes in the \$45,000 to \$55,000 price range.

The first phase of Chestnut Lake includes 25 three and four bedroom homes which should be available in March.
