The Clinic was organized to provide a wide range of health services to families residing in an area of Charlotte surrounding Alexander Street which includes Piedmont Courts and Earle Village. Enrollment is offered to all families located within the area of Charlotte bounded on the west by N. College Street, on the north by E. 22nd Street, E 24th Street, and Catawba, on the east by Louise Avenue and Hawthorne Lane and the Northwest Expressway, and on the south by East Trade Street. If there is some doubt as to whether a particular residence is included within the boundaries you should contact the Clinic for clarification

The Clinic is staffed by two full time physicians and a team of paramedical personnel to provide health education, counseling, health maintenance services and greater continuity of care. The Clinic provides all outpatient medical care except prenatal and dental services. Included in their wide range of services
