UNC-TV To Broadcast Black Moses, April 25

Thomas Peters has been called a black Moses who led more than 1,200 former slaves back to Africa after the American colonies won Independence from Great Britian

But his story has remained virtually unknown except in specialized books on black history. Research prompted by the American Bicentennial has focused new attention on Peters, and his connection with North Carolina.

His story is reenacted as part of a new documentary film to be broadcast over the UNC-TV Network at 7:30 p.m., Sunday April 25.
