The proposals presented will vary from improvement of existing Independence Boulevard to a relocated freeway. The right-of-way for the portion of the proposed relocation from the Northwest freeway to Independence at Kenilworth has been acquired. The remaining right-of-way will be that necessary to contain the construction. Access control will depend upon the design selected.

DOT is conducting the public hearing to provide the public with an explanation of the alternate design treatments. right-of-way requirements and procedures. Relocation advisory assistance will be offered and the State-Federal relationship will be explained.
