The Charlotte Bummers slammed 16 hits and produced 22 runs to defeat the Morris-Field Rangers, 22-7, in a Triple County Semi-pro League baseball game Sunday afternoon.

It was the first setback of the year for the losers and the fifth victory of the year for the winners, who roughed-up five ringer pitchers with their biggest offensive explosion of the campaign.

Duke Pitts led the attack with a single and three-run homer while Alfred Thompson was setting the pace for the losers with a triple, a single and four rbi's.

Thompson also supplied the biggest offensive punch to the Rangers' 12-1 verdict over the Morning Grove Hawks in a league encounter Saturday afternoon. The little second-sacker clouted a home run and a double while accounting for five runs driven in.

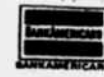
