With 103 percent of the \$261, 891 goal, ASC has exceeded the campaign goal for the second consecutive year.

Campaign chairman R. Vincent Sparcklin announced the drive results to the ASC board of directors at a regualr meeting yesterday afternoon.

For the second year, Korf Industries and Midrex Corporation gave ten percent of the goal. The increase of \$3,818 over their 1975 gift was made in the form of a challenge grant to the community to be matched by new corporate gifts. The challenge produced \$4,070 in new contributions from 49 companies.

ASC president William H. Williamson III said, "Korf Industries' high level of corporate leadership was a real inspiration to the entire cam-
