The bulk of the funds \$8,485,975 - will be used to construct:

the Long Creek-Paw Creek interceptors (major wastewater collection lines), pumping stations, and force

wastewater treatment plant improvements at both the Irwin Creek and Sugar Creek plants

(3) Irwin Creek interceptor linking the Irwin Creek wastewater treatment plant to the McAlpine Creek wastewater treatment plant; and

a new three million gallon-per-day wastewater treatment plant and interceptor in the Mallard Creek drainage basin.

The rest of the money \$5,739,862 - will be used to build a 3.5 million gallon-perday capacity plant
