

# Silver Mount Baptist Church To Observe 10th Appreciation Day

# Cancer Seen In Smoker-Drinker

EARLIER ORAL CANCER SEEN IN SMOKER-DRINKERS: A ten-year study at Roswell Park Memorial Institute in Buffalo, the New York State Department of Health's comprehensive cancer center, shows that women who use alcohol and tobacco may develop oral cancer as many as 15 years earlier than women who abstain from these products.

Irwin Bross, Ph.D., director of the institute's biostatistics department, said data compiled on 2,118 female patients who cooperated in the study between 1957 and 1966 clearly indicates an increased risk from combined alcohol and

tobacco use. One hundred forty-five of the women surveyed were later diagnosed as having cancers of the mouth and/or tongue. In the 40-64 age category, 10 of these women were abstainers; that is, they neither smoked or drank.

Fifteen used tobacco alone; five were light drinkers who did not smoke; 33 were light drinkers who did smoke, and 18 were heavy drinkers and smokers. In the over 65 age group, there were no heavy drinkers and smokers and only four women who drank moderately and smoked.

"It is clear that the use of both alcohol and tobacco caused an earlier onset of oral cancer among these women", Dr. Bross said. "For those who used neither product, onset of the disease usually did not occur until after age 65."

WOMEN STUDENTS IN DENTAL SCHOOLS DOUBLE IN NUMBER: The nation's dental schools now have 1,861 female students-double the number two years ago. The American Dental Association reports that of 5,763 first-year dental students, 707 - 12 percent - are women. Women now make up 9 percent of the 20,767 total enrollment in dental schools.

THE MORTALITY RISK with the use of contraception is lower than the risk of death from childbirth and pregnancy without birth control, according to a report by Dr. Christopher Tietze. The analysis by Dr. Tietze found this to be true for most women, except those over 40 years of age who use oral contraceptives. At that point, the pill carries a somewhat higher mortality risk, he reported. He based the analysis on information about women from the United States and Great Britain.

SCALP MASSAGE HARMFUL?: Vigorous scalp mas-

sage is a "no no" if you want to keep your hair, according to Dr. Joseph B. Jerome of the AMA's Department of Drugs. "Shampoo and dry gently, and avoid scalp massage," says Dr. Jerome who insists that neither the scalp nor the hair roots need massage.

He says vigorous scalp massage, with or without a shampoo, and regardless of whether the hair is dry, wet, or being briskly towed dry, it's mechanically damaging to the hair. Vigorous manipulation of hair, whether by massaging, brushing, or combing, tends to break hair mechanically and thus to produce characteristic artificial alopecia (the hair roots are still healthy and visible, but there is not much to show for it above the scalp), he said.

BREAST-FEEDING by mothers should be encouraged by physicians, according to a report by the American Academy of Pediatrics' Committee on Nutrition. The committee's statement said, "breast milk has not been improved on as a reference standard" for infant nutrition, and the physical contact that breast-feeding entails promotes better interaction between mother and infant, if contact is desired by the mother.

The committee also cautioned against issuing "dire warnings to mothers who cannot or do not wish to breast-feed; normal growth and development are possible without it."

## City Gets Grant For Wastewater Facilities

The City of Charlotte has been awarded more than \$14 million in federal grants for wastewater treatment facilities. News of the grants was received today from Congressman James Martin's office.

The bulk of the funds - \$8,485,975 - will be used to construct:

- (1) the Long Creek-Paw Creek interceptors (major wastewater collection lines), pumping stations, and force mains
- (2) wastewater treatment plant improvements at both the Irwin Creek and Sugar Creek plants
- (3) Irwin Creek interceptor linking the Irwin Creek wastewater treatment plant to the McAlpine Creek wastewater treatment plant; and
- (4) a new three million gallon-per-day wastewater treatment plant and interceptor in the Mallard Creek drainage basin.

The rest of the money - \$5,739,862 - will be used to build a 3.5 million gallon-per-day capacity plant.
