With "Sparkle"

Aretha Franklin's "SPAR-KLE" album on Atlantic Records, music from the Warner Bros. motion picture, composed and produced by Curtis Mayfield, has been certified gold by the RIAA for U.S.sales in excess of 500,000 units, it was announced by Jerry Greenberg, President of Atlantic Records.

"SPÅRKLE" was released in the U.S. on May 24, and was certified gold in six weeks. The album represents Aretha's first collaboration with Curtis Mayfield (recorded at his Curtom Studios in Chicago), and contains both sides of Aretha's current number 1 R&B single, "SOMETHING HE CAN FEEL" b-w "LOV-ING YOU BABY."

Aretha Franklin has attained RIAA gold certification previously for six Atlantic "AMAZING albums: GRACE," "YOUNG, GIFTED AND BLACK," "LIVE AT FILLMORE WEST," "ARE-THA NOW," "LADY SOUL," and "I NEVER LOVED A YOU." In addition, Aretha has earned a total of 14 RIAA gold singles in her 10 years with


