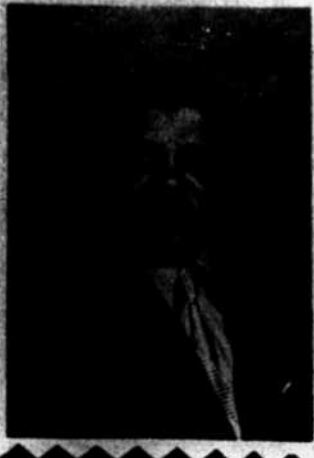
Sponsor Trip To
