Pic N Pay Opens Two New Stores

Pic 'N Pay Stores, Inc. (AMEX) launched its expansion program for the fiscal year ending June 1977 with the grand opening of August 26 of two new stores in Charlotte.

Children from families whose income is at or below the evels shown are eligible for free and reduced price meals and free milk. In addition, families not meeting these criteria but with other unusual expenses due to high medical expenses, shelter costs in excess of 30 percent of income, special education expensed due to the mental or physical condition of a child, and disaster or casualty losses are also urged to apply.

Application forms will be sent to all parents. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during

the year. In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a family has foster children living with them and wishes to apply for such meals and milk for them, the family

should contact the school. Under the provisions of the policy a school principal willeview applications and determine eligibility. A parent who is dissatisfied with the ruling of the principal may make a request either orally or in writing to the chairman of individual school committee for a hearing to appeal the decision. The policy contains an outline of the hearing


