The second annual North Carolina Conference on Black Studies (NCCBS) will be held October 8-9 at the Holiday Inn-North in Charlotte, according to a statement released by NCCBS recently.

The conference, whose theme is "Black Studies: Calling for a New Order," will feature workshops on curriculum, youth, and job development, research, and training. The goals of the conference include structuring and strengthening of NCCBS, developing a program of action on the community and school levels, and getting more involved with community leaders and citizens, and school personnel and students.

Featured speakers will be Dr. Joseph Russell of Indiana University, Executive Director of the National Conference on Black Studies (NCBS), and Dr. Sonja Stone, co-director of the Afro-American Studies Curriculum at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

Registration for the conference ends September 15. Fees are \$15 for adults and \$10 for students. Fees paid after the September 15 deadline will include an added \$2.50 late charge.
