It was following the Nationals that Melissa's brother decided to retire, and she and Johnny "got together."

By 1975 Johnny and Melissa completed two undefeated years as National Pair Champions. In World competitions they placed eighth in 1974 and sixth in 1975.

Aware that it is most unusual for a pair of skaters to achieve such phenominal success in their first years as a team, Johnny credits their good fortune to individual experience in competitive skating

"Competitions were nothing new to either of us. It was simply a matter of developing unison and style.
