Hall testified at the trial that he was taught to make molotov cocktails, which are fire-bombs, by members of the Wilmington Ten. His sworn statement of August, 1976, however, said Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Agent William S. Walden taught him how to make molotov cocktails and "showed me what dynamite looks like."

Hall's statement gave the reason for his change of testimony as wanting to let the Black people know the "truth" - that Rev. Chavis was not guilty. He said he lied initially so that the prosecutor would be lenient with him on cases against him which were pending at the time of the Wilmington Ten trial. Hall said that Assistant Prosecutor Jay Stroud told him that he would get six months for his testimony but in fact he served 4 years.

Hall said he was also afraid for the safety of his family at the time he testified because court and law enforcement officers told him: Rev. Ben Chavis had someone to threaten his family. Hall said in the statement that Prosecutor Stroud told him "the best way to get him (Chavis) is through the law. He said, because the law has so many quirks and turns in it." Stroud could not be reached for comment.

Chavis charged that former U.S. Attorney General John Mitchell and former Assistant Attorney General Robert Mardian, both convicted Water-gate criminals, framed the Wilmington Ten and other political activists through the U.S. Justice Department's COINTELPRO, a program which illegally disrupted the civil rights movement.

What will happen as a result of Hall's statement and Chavis' charges is uncertain. Rev. Irv Joyner, a staff member of the Commission for Racial Justice of the United Church of Christ, plans to call on the U.S. Justice Department for prosecution of state and federal officials implicated by Hall's testimony.

Rev. Ben Chavis in today's Carolina Community News Service interview called for North Carolinians to write to U.S. Magistrate Logan Howell to demand bail for the Wilmington Ten.
