recognized expert on the problems of health care delivery for the nation's poor and minority citizens, attended a recent meeting of the Board of the campus of the Atlanta institution. The Board of Overseers is an advisory body to the Morehouse College Board of Trustees and to the Dean of the Program, Louis W. Sullivan, M.D. The Board of Overseers Chairman is Dr. Edgar E. Smith, Provost of the University of Massachusetts Medical School.

The Board of Overseers has a total membership of 31; members represent health providers, foundation and corporation presidents, medical school administrators and educators, and community service organization leaders. A national body, the Board convenes twice yearly to receive reports on the progress of the school's development and to lend expertise and assistance in areas such as curriculum development, facilities planning, fund raising, recruitment, etc.

The Medical Education Program will begin in 1977-78 as a two-year school of the basic medical sciences. After the first two years of medical school, students will transfer into guaranteed places at degree-granting institutions. These guarantees are being developed at Meharry Medical College, Howard University College of Medicine, and Emory University School of

Medicine.

In addition to receiving instruction in the basic medical sciences, students will receive training in areas conducive to encouraging them to become more sensitive to the needs of their patients and to practice in underserved areas.

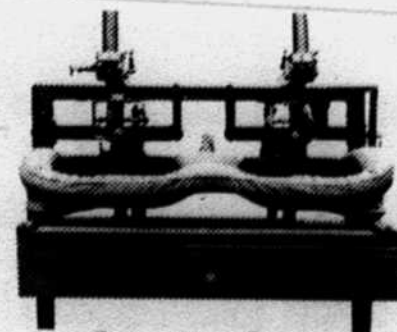
