### **A&T Turner Wins MEAC Award**

A&T's quarterback Elsworth Turner, who led the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference in passing, total offense and scoring, Thursday was named offensive player of the year in the seven-team conference by the Sports Information Directors and head football coaches in the seven-team conference.

Turner, 6-0, 185-pound junior from Gaithersburg, Maryland, beat his teammate Dexter Feaster and flanker Mark Durden of Morgan State for the offensive award this year in the MEAC.

In passing for a conference record 2,046 yards this season, Turner completed 153 of 273 passes for 12 touchdowns with

only 10 interceptions. His total offense average of 178.5 yards per game was by far the best offensive average in the con-

ference. Turner scored a total of 82 points this season on seven touchdowns, kicked 20 of 28 extra points and booted six of 10 field goals tries.

Feaster finished second in the balloting for the offensive award.
