**Divorce Series Begins Monday**

Last year for the first time, more people got divorced than married in Mecklenburg County. For several months, WBTV News Reporter, Andrew Schorr has been investi-

gating why, and he comes up with some of the reasons in a mini-documentary series entitled "Til Death Do Us Part?" on WBTV's 6 O'clock Scene Tonight, beginning

Monday, February 14th, which is, appropriately, Valentine's Day.

The series does not speak in generalities, instead it features divorced people who talk about their specific problems in the hope that their experiences might help others in similar situations.

Among the people interviewed are a successful business woman whose career became more important than her marriage; a college professor who shares equal custody of his children with his ex-wife; and a salesman who received help from Charlotte's first "Divorce Counselor."

The mini-documentary series will be shown in five parts, Monday, February 14th through Friday, February 18th on the 6 O'clock Scene Tonight on Channel Three.

**Johnny Mathis Will Perform Live Here**

JOHNNY MATHIS, who has often been called "the greatest romantic singer of all time," will perform live, and full concert orchestra, Saturday, February 26th at Ovens Auditorium, for two performances at 7 p.m. and 10 p.m.

When Mathis was 19 years old, he signed a recording contract with Columbia records. A string of hit singles and albums have followed his first release, "Wonderful, Wonderful." It was a national hit, followed by "It's Not For Me To Say" and "Chances Are." Mathis has since produced 18 gold albums.

One album, "Johnny's Greatest Hits," was on "Billboard's" best-selling charts

for nine and one half years, longer than any album by any other artist.

Mathis is also popular in concert. He repeatedly receives standing ovations from his audiences.


