National Guardsmen

Plan Recruiting Drive

RALEIGH-North Carolina National Guardsmen will participate in the most ambitious recruiting and rentention drive in the state guard's 210-year history between now and September 30.

According to the recruiting office of the 108th Division on Westover Street, local residents should expect increased media exposure to the existence of the guard and its benefits.

Brigadier General William K. Holoman, deputy Adjutant General of North Carolina, said the future of the Guard depends on recruiting successes which are part of a national effort to increase reserve force strength.

The National Guard is a part of the modern reserve component forces of the U.S. Army and Air Force. It has historical origins in the militia of pre-Revolutionary War America.

Since the end of the draft and reduction of active forces following Vietnam, nearly half of the United State's national security is provided by the reserve components. Personnel costs to the nation for maintaining a Guardsman is only 20 percent of the cost of maintaining a person on active duty.

Although the North Carolina Guard is in better shape than most other states, Holoman said over 1,100 persons will have to be recruited to bring the Guard to full strength by Sept. 30.

In order to achieve this goal, each of the 150 Guard units in the state will have to increase its strength by 10 percent more than its strength May 31.

"The only way we can reach this goal is for every man and woman in the Guard to become involved in recruiting. We've got to get more people in the National Guard interested in getting more people into the National Guard," Holoman said.

The general hopes that there will be an increase in the number of first-time enlistments while the "Get Your Guard Up" program is underway.

"While we want enlistments from people with prior military experience also, the long-term future of the Guard depends on raising the number of persons who are entering military service for the first time."

When the draft ended, so did the Guard's role as an honorable alternative to regular military service.

Now the National Guard offers itself, not as an alternative, but as an attractive activity with many incentives for a high school graduate to enlist for six years for men or three years for women, he said.

The Guard can provide highly technical training in many fields and pay a person who is receiving that training. A high-school graduate who wishes to attend college can, by enlisting in the North Carolina Guard, receive up to \$500 a year in tuition assistance as well as normal pay and allowances.

"By the end of September I hope all of our 12,000 people will have worked on recruiting," he said.


