Parents of public school children in Charlotte-Mecklenburg will be given the opportunity to look in on some instructional television that children in grades K-12 can benefit from during the school day as part of their classroom activities as a result of the cooperative efforts of the UNC-TV Network and the State Department of Public Instruction.

Four evenings in September the UNC-TV Network with the state education agency will show teachers, school administrators, parents, and others that instructional television offers high-quality programming for students in the classroom.

"School Television Previews" will feature TV series for grades K-6 on Monday and Tuesday, September 5-6, from 8-9 p.m. A different one-hour program will be shown each evening. Instructional televi-

sion for students in junior and senior high schools will be previewed the following week on Monday and Tuesday, September 12-13. A different special preview program will be aired each evening from 8-9 p.m.
