Between June 1976 and June 1977, the average cost of a new home in the United States increased from \$47,000 to \$53, 100, according to data releas-ed by the Federal Home Loan Bank Board.

Deadline Set For Absentee Ballots

According to Glenda White, absentee supervisor for the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections, the deadline for thereturn of absentee ballots for the 1977 primary election is Monday, September 26 at 5 p.m. The deadline for a request for an application of absentee ballot was Wednesday, September 21.

According to Ms. White, voters may mail their ballots in to the board of elections, 710 East 4th Street, may come by and bring it in, or send it by someone. "Just as long as we receive it by September 26 at 5

Ms. White said that as of September 15, 59 ballots have been sent out and 34 have already returned. She said many ballots come in close to the deadline and she is still ex-pecting many more. As of the same time last year, 85 ballots were sent out and 82 came back on or before the deadline.

Ms. White said that all ballots must be notorized be-fore their return. She said that many people do not get their ballots counted because they didn't get them back by the deadline. She emphasized that ballots postmarked by the 26 will not be counted if they are not in their office by September 26 at 5 p.m.
