
Let us consider, first, what peace is. The English word peace, the Latin equivalent 'pax," and the Greek word "eirene" are all negative terms which mean the absence of war, strife or confusion. By contrast, the Bible meaning of peace-the Hebrew word is 'shalom'' which means wellbeing or wholeness. It is a positive term used to describe the total well-being of man and society. Thus, the Bible views man as a whole person, not something divided into seperate parts. So, then, the peace of man has to do with his relationship with his world, his fellow man and his God.




WEEPING WILLOW AND CATHEY MEMORIAL




