One Phone Call Gets

Entire Medical Services

Beginning this month, your telephone call for ambulance service will put you in touch with the entire emergency medical services (EMS) system in Mecklenburg County, including both franchised providers and volunteer units.

When you dial 376-5671, you will reach the Central Medical Emergency Dispatch (CMED). CMED will, in turn, dispatch the appropriate vehicle. In emergency situations the volunteer "first responder" closest to you will be dispatched.

This expanded service has been made possible by the County's purchase of new communications equipment for volunteer units. The equipment links these seven volun-

teer first responder units with other EMS units: the Charlotte Life Saving and First Aid Crew, Inc.; Cooks Volunteer Fire Department; Newell Volunteer Fire Department, the Wilkinson Boulevard Volunteer Fire Department; U-Meck Rescue, Inc.; Providence Volunteer Fire Department, and the North Mecklenburg Ambulance Service. CMED makes it possible for all County citizens to access emergency medical services by dialing one telephone number, 376-5671. It also permits control and coordination of services from one dispatch location.

County Government has the legal responsibility for providing ambulance service throughout the County. The EMS coordinator is Robert Conklin.

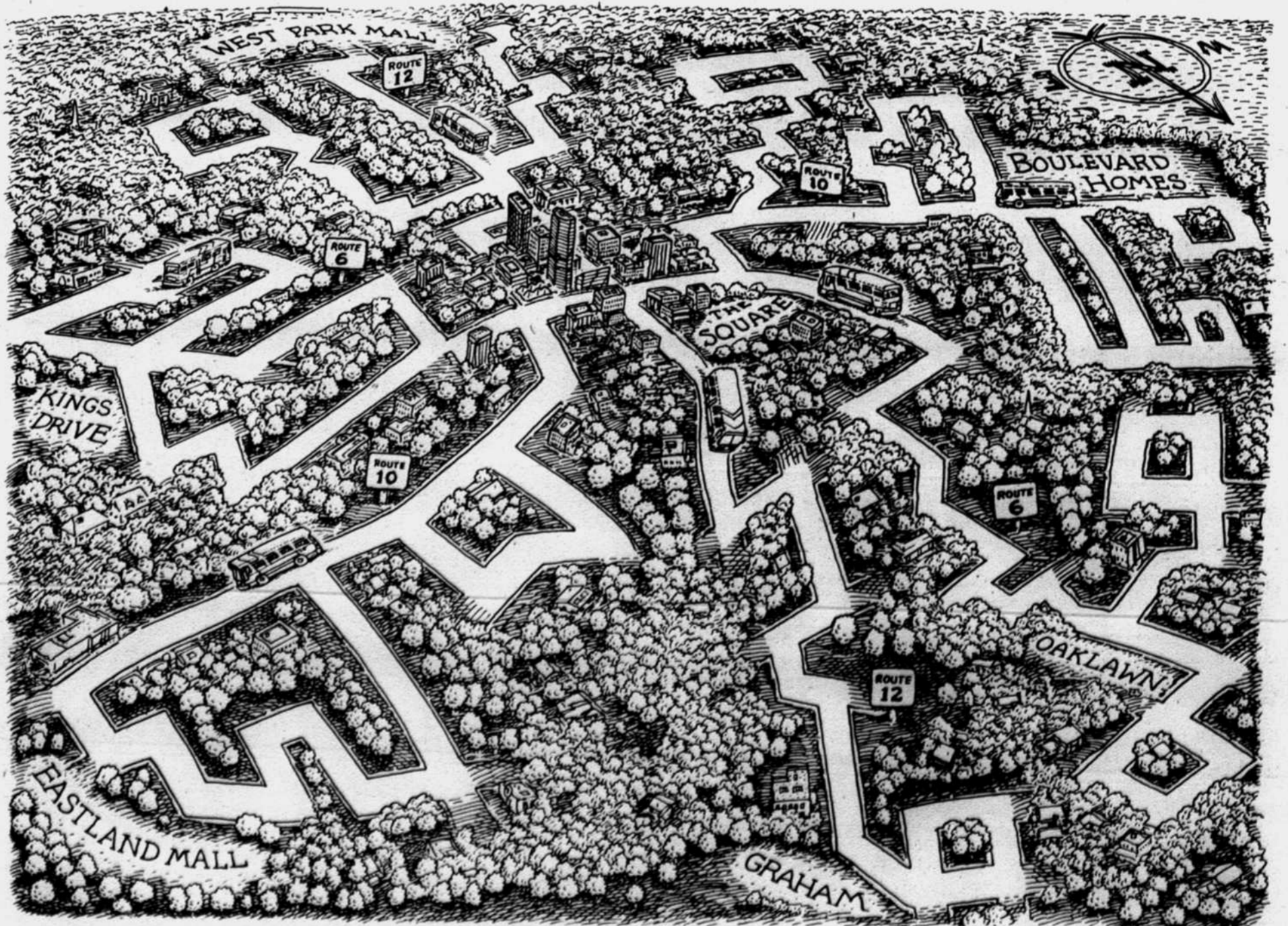
