Dr. J. N. MacCormack, Head of the Communicable Disease Control Branch, Department of Human Resources, said he was pleased that the restuarants chain had agreed to help encourage parents to have their children immunized. He said that while this effort is part of the year-long Immunization Initi-

'These children are required by state law to be protected from the childhood diseases before they can enter school," Dr. MacCormack said. "Our desire is to vaccinate as many as we can before the Summer months, when very heavy demand on them." The recommended immunization schedule will protect agaist polio, measles, mumps, rubella (German measles), whooping cough, diphtheria, and tetanus.
