It's springtime at McDowell Park, and the paddle boats, picnic tables and campsites are ready and waiting for you!

The County owned and operated park, located of N. C. 49, is open seven days a week, from dawn to dusk, and it's free. The camping, picnicking, hiking and fishing facilities are available all week, and you can rent a paddle boat on Saturdays and Sundays, 10 A. M. to 6:30 P. M., during April and May, for 50 cents per half hour. Starting in June, the paddle boats will be rented seven days a week.

No swimming will be allowed at McDowell Park during the 1978 summer season.

Located on Lake Wylie, the 140-acre park has an entrance on N. C. 49 south of Charlotte. Its trails lead through hardwood forests, down to the lake, where there are piers for fishing and a sandy beach for sunning. Group picnic shelters rent for \$5 for a half day and \$10 for a full day, and campsites are \$2 for a tent site, \$3 for a tent site with water and electricity, and \$4 for a recreational vehicle site.
