Women Task Force Sets Conference On Alcohol, Drug Abuse

A two-day state conference on Women and Alcohol and Drug Abuse will be held here in September. The date and site for the Conference will be announced soon.

Sponsors of the conference are the North Carolina Women's Task Force on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, Mecklenburg County Commission on the Status of Women and the Women's Advocacy Committee: Alcohol and Drug Abuse for Mecklenburg County.

The theme for the first annual conference is "Out of the Closet." It will focus on ways to meet the special needs

of women in preventing and treating drug and alcohol problems and innovative means for motivating women to avail themselves of existing services.

The program will include workshops on cultural factors in drug and alcohol abuse, methods of treatment, exemplary programs and the role of the family and the law. It will be geared toward professionals in the field of alcohol and drug abuse, but is open to the public.

The conference will present an award to Betty Ford, the former First Lady, for the significant role she has played

in making the public aware of the problem of alcohol and drug abuse among women, and in helping other women with similar problems come "out of the closet" and into treatment.

The North Carolina Women's Task Force on Alcohol and Drug Abuse was formed as an ad hoc committee in the fall of 1977 as part of the National Coalition on Women's Issues in drugs, alcohol, mental health, and women's rights. Through surveys, the task force has found a lack of awareness and commitment to the special needs of women by the drug

alcohol agencies in the state. To address these needs, a seven member task force was appointed by Dr. Sarah Morrow, Secretary of Human Resources. Chairperson of the Task Force is Phyllis Grubb, Butler.

The Mecklenburg County Commission on the Status of Women was established August 2, 1977. The first county funded commission to improve the status of women in North Carolina. It consists of nine members, both men and women, from varied backgrounds, appointed by the County Commission. Its chairperson is Deborah Motto, Women's Advocacy Committee: Alcohol and Drug Abuse for Mecklenburg County. A coalition of Women representing Open House, Innovative, the Charlotte Drug Education Center, Bethlehem Center, Randolph Clinic, South Street Center, Area Mental Health, the Charlotte Commission on Alcoholism, and the Commission on the Status of Women.

The committee was formed last year to serve as an advocate for the special needs of women as they relate to alcohol and drug abuse and

to enhance the status of women in the alcohol and drug abuse professions. Its chairperson is Patricia A. Lloyd. Further information on the conference may be obtained from Patricia A. Lloyd (704) 393-8000 or 8109.
