Prestigious Greater Griertown Open Begins Here Saturday

More than 120 Charlotte area golfers, including special invited guests, are putting the final polishing touches on their games in preparation for the eighth annual Greater Grier Town Open Golf Tournament here this weekend.

Expected to be one of the season's premier tee events, the tourney begins Saturday morning at Crystal Springs Golf Course near Pineville.

Tee time is 10 a.m. and arrangements can be made for last-minute entry by calling Robert Sanders of 3515

Banbury Dr. or call 392-5665. Sanders, co-chairman of the prestigious event, says entry fees will be \$38 per person including green fees and carts for both days.

The golfers will play 36 holes, with the first 18 holes determining the alignment for the five flights.

According to Sanders, trophies and certificates will be given to the first three finishers in each flight and special prizes will be awarded to the golfer hitting closest to hole on number 6 and the one

who strikes the longest drive off number 11 both days.

The participants make up a veritable list of "Who's Who" in local golfdom, with such great golfers as Haywood Stevenson, Phil Neely, Donald Littlejohn, Harry Gray, Otha Gamble, Milton Murray and Doug Grier, Robert "Git" Brown battling for top honors in the championship flight which Littlejohn won a year ago.
