In February 1979 Jane Pauley Coming To Pfeiffer

Jane Pauley will appear on the Campus of Pfeiffer College on February 9, 1979 as part of the North Carolina Political Issues Forum. Ms. Pauley is the co-host of the long running "Today" show on NBC.

Since joining the "Today" show in '76, Ms. Pauley has not been restricted to in-studio work. She has reported from distant places like Nashville, Arizona, Plymouth, Massachusetts, Detroit, and Plans, Georgia. She also covered the Silver Jubilee of Que a Elizabeth II in London, Eng. and.

Prior to co-hosting the "Today" show, she spent a year as co-anchor of the nightly news on NBC's WMAQ-TV in Chicago, Illinois. She was the lirst female to ever hold this position in that city.

Born in Indianapolis, Indiana October 31, 1950, she is a graduate of Indiana University where she received a BS in Political Science. Upon graduating from college, she became involved in politics for a brief period before joining WISH-TV in Indianapolis as a mid-day anchor and weekend reporter. In 1975, Ms. Pauley was the winner of a nationwide search by WMAQ-TV for an anchorperson to co-host their nightly news program with Floyd Kalber. Six months later, she came to NBC.

She was the recipient of an honorary Doctor of Journalism degree from DePaul University in May 1978. She is the youngest person in history to ver receive an honorary docorate from this college.

The North Carolina Political Issues Forum is an on-going speaker's series inaugurated by Jimmy Carter in 1975.
