Scattering Bulbs Is

If you've been waiting to plant a shrub, plant a tree or scatter some bulbs around the landscape, the season to do it here.

Some suggestions for fall and winter planting and transplanting from agricultural extension specialists at NCSU: Consider "naturalistic" or random plantings of spring flowering bulbs. Some situations may call for planting in rows, but in many instances the results will give more pleasing effect if the plants appear to have scattered naturally. Bulbs are planted early-October-November in most sections of the state.

"Natural Look"

When buying shrubs and trees, there are a multitude of retailers of these high demand plants during this heavy buying season—so shop wisely. Avoid spindly, "leggy" plants. Go for the compact shrub with healthy color. Also avoid any barerooted plant whose roots have been exposed to wind, sun or otherwise allowed to dry out. Keeping roots moist is a must for plant survival. Generally shrubs or trees with bare roots (not balled and burlapped or in a container) are safe to plant this time of year, provided their roots haven't been allowed to dry.
