cepts responsibility for the actions of his disciples and declares that he himself is Lord of the Sabbath and entitled to use that day as he sees fit. Comparing this with the same passage in Mark 2:27, Jesus adds that the Sabbath was made for man and not man for the same. So, then, the Sabbath should be used for the glory of God and use of man. But, the scribes and Pharisees had made it a burdensome thing.

There is much unnecessary controversy over whether or not Christians are observing the Sabbath on the right day. Let us get our facts straight at the beginning and see if it will not solve many of our difficulties. First, of all, the Sabbath day and the Lord's day are two different days. The Sabbath is on Saturday and the Lord's Day is on Sunday.

Christians do not observe the Sabbath, therefore, all terms or phrases that include the word Sabbath in making references to Sunday are wrong and misleading. Secondly, the Sabbath and the Lord's Day celebrate two different events. The Sabbath celebrates the rest of God following the six days of creation. The Lord's Day celebrates the rising of Jesus from the dead.

In any event, neither the laws of the Sabbath nor their implications extend to the Christians. Still, human beings need a period of time during their work week to rest, relax and recreate themselves through spending meaningful time with family and friends. We need some time to consider ourselves-the purpose and course our lives take. Most of all we need some time to seriously and prayerfully-yes worshipfully-consider God and the place should have and demands time in our lives. For most of us, Sunday provides this needed opportunity. But, those who are required to work on Sunday are without excuse. For, everyday is holy unto the Lord. We must all find one day that we may dedicate to the Lord. By doing so, we fulfill the spiritual intent of the law.

Butcher Block

Butcher block wooden work surfaces can take a lot of rough treatment, but try to avoid saturating them with water which causes warping. To clean a butcher block, wipe it quickly with lukewarm water or mild suds and dry. Re-season when necessary by pouring boiled linseed oil over wood surfaces and rubbing it in with fine steel wool.
