





Decrease In Admissions And Runaways

RALEIGH-There has been a significant decrease in admissions and runaways at the state's five training schools for delinquent youth in the past few months. The schools are operated by the N.C. Department of Human Resources' Division of Youth Services.

"Since status offenders are no longer admitted to the state's training schools, we are experiencing a decrease in student population," said Robert Atkinson, assistant director for Institutional Ser-

vices in the division. From July through October 1977, there were 363 young-sters admitted to the five training schools. For the same bere were only 22 admiss

Status offenders are those nmit crimes for which duit would not be arrested, such as truency or running away from home. Beginning in July 1978, status offenders could no longer be sent to the ning onger be sent to the chools by the courts.
