Persons wishing to object to approval of an application by HUD may make such objection known to the appropriate HUD Area Office. HUD will consider objections made only on the following grounds: The applicant's description of needs and objectives is plainly inconsistent with available facts and data; or the activities to be undertaken are plainly inappropriate to meeting the needs and objectives identified by the applicant; or the application does not comply with the requirements of the law; or the application proposes activities which are otherwise ineligible under the law.

Such objections should include both an identification of the requirements not met and, in the case of objections made on the grounds that the description of needs and objectives is plainly inconsistent with significant, generally available facts and data, the data upon which the persons rely. Although HUD will consider objections submitted at any time, such objections should be submitted within 30 days of the publication of the notice that the application has been submitted to HUD. In order to ensure that objections submitted will be considered during the review process, HUD will not approve an application until at least 45 days after receipt of an application.

FY-80 CAPITAL GRANT APPLICATION RE: Application by the City of Charlotte for Federal Capital Assistance for the purchase of capital equipment for the Charlotte's intra-city bus system.

I. Notice is hereby given that a Public Hearing will be held by the City of Charlotte in the second floor council chamber of the Charlotte City Hall, 600 East Trade Street, Charlotte, N.C., at 7:30 p.m., on April 26, 1979, for the purpose of considering a project for which financial assistance is being sought from the Urban Mass Transportation Administration, pursuant to the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, generally described as follows:

- A. Description of Project:
 1. General description of items to be purchased:
 - a. Purchase 42 advance design buses
 - b. Purchase 4 specially equipped E&H vehicles
 - c. Refurbish 78 buses with energy absorbing bumpers
 - d. Spare components
 - e. Radio system improvements
 - f. Shop tools and equipment
 - g. Office equipment
 - h. Office furniture
 - i. Purchase 6 service vehicles
 - j. Purchase and install 51 bus passenger shelters
 - k. Purchase and install 34 bus passenger benches
 1. Purchase and install 1,000 bus stop signs and 78 information boards

3. Cost of Project and Method of Financing Local Share:

Federal Grant Requested (80 percent) \$4,939,498
Local Share (20 percent) 1,236,875
Total Gross Project Cost \$6,176,373

The local share of the funds for this project will be provided by Public Transportation System Bonds which were accepted by the Charlotte voters during the April 8, 1975

bond referendum for purchasing the then privately owned bus system, acquiring new equipment, and installing certain improvements, including bus passenger shelters.

B. Relocation: No person, families, and/or businesses will be displaced on this project.

C. Environment: The proposed project will not have any significant adverse environmental impact upon the urban area.

D. Comprehensive Planning: This project is in conformance with comprehensive land use and transportation planning in this area. The project is currently under review by the A-95 clearing-house and the 204 Review Agency.

E. Elderly and Handicapped: The elderly and handicapped will be given due consideration during the administration of this project. Four vehicles specially equipped for use by the handicapped are to be purchased under this project budget. Shelters and benches which are part of the project, are to be located giving special consideration to the needs of the elderly and handicapped.

II. At the hearing, the City of Charlotte will afford an opportunity for interested persons or agencies to be heard with respect to the social, economic, and environmental aspects of the project.

III.
