

Coulwood Concert Band To Compete In Six Flags Festival

The Coulwood Junior High School Concert Band will join bands from throughout the region to compete in the 17th annual Six Flags National Band Festival scheduled for Friday and Saturday, April 27 and 28.

This year's celebrated festival will be held at the Georgia World Congress Center facilities in Atlanta.

To qualify for the invitational event, bands must have earned a Division I rating or equivalent during the year.

Groups will vie for "Best in Class" honors and will be evaluated by nationally recognized adjudicators.

Following the competition, participants will visit Six Flags Over Georgia to enjoy the family entertainment centers rides, shows and attractions. Band clinics will be offered at the park with special entertainment by the Commodores, the U.S. Navy's Jazz ensemble.

Six Flags is located on I-20 west, ten minutes from downtown Atlanta.

The Coulwood band will depart from the school at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, April 26. A total of 90 people including 79 students, 10 chaperones and the director will be going on the trip. They will travel on two buses furnished by the Carolina Transit Bus Company.

The group will be performing music of grade IV difficulty taken from the North Carolina Band Contest-Festival list. The selections are Folklore For Band by Jim Audy Caudill and Symphonic Overture by Charles Carter. The Back-Talk March by Richard Bowles will be the warm-up selection.

Keep Suitcases In Shape With Care

Traveling can take a heavy toll on luggage. Suitcases will stay in good shape longer with proper care, say specialists with the North Carolina Agricultural Extension Service.

The kind of maintenance they need depends on the construction of the luggage. Where combinations of materials are used, each material may call for a different kind of attention.

According to the specialists, smooth leather may be cleaned with saddle soap, then rubbed with paste wax or neutral shoe cream. Apply lemon oil to shade brown leather to a darker hue.

Vinyl and other plastics can be washed with a sudsy sponge or cloth, then wiped with a liquid wax to protect their surface. Special vinyl cleaners are also available.

Fabric luggage requires suds and water care. For fabrics coated with stain repellent or clear plastic, treat heavy soil with a solution of two tablespoons of ammonia to one pint of water. Sponge on, rinse and dry. Preserve with a light application of liquid wax.

Use a spot remover for stains on uncoated fabric. After cleaning, coat the fabric with a stain or water repellent finish.

Metal suitcases should be cleaned with a cleaning solvent designed especially for metal. Be sure the pieces are completely dry before waxing or applying stain and/or water repellent sprays.

Clean dry luggage should be stored away from extremes in temperature and humidity. To save space, place smaller pieces inside larger pieces.
