UNCC Passes

\$1 Million

Mark In Grants For the first time ever, the

University of North Carolina at Charlotte has passed the \$1 million mark in grants awarded to the university during a single academic year.

Barry Lesley, director of academic grants and contracts, said that as of June 7, a total of \$1,027,225.75 had been awarded UNCC during 1978-

UNCC received \$78,663.25 during May to push the year's total past \$1 million.

That money came from sources outside the university. Lesley says the bulk came from the federal government, but other grants were obtained from local, state and private agencies to fund various projects.

The grants support faculty research projects, training programs, continuing education and extension opportunities, seminars, workshops and conferences, all of which reflect directly on the commun-

"Our faculty deserves the credit for this expanded outreach program of the univer-sity," said Lesley. "They put in a lot of hard work and time in preparing proposals to seek funding for the various projects.

Once the grant proposals are filed, it's up to the funding source to determine how much money will be allotted to the project.

Lesley says funding from external sources has increased three-fold in the last four years. Total funding for 1975-76 was \$330,000. During that four-year period, UNCC has obtained just over \$3 million in outside grants -- one-third of it within the current fiscal year.


