In applying the new guidelines, schools and institutions may consider both the income of the family during the previous 12 months and the family's current rate of income, to determine which is the better indicator of a child's need.

Children whose parents become unemployed will be eligible during the period of unemployment, if the loss of income places the family within the eligibility limits.
