Eddie B. Battle, a resident of Charlotte and a Prudential Insurance agent was among some 6,000 members of the Million Dollar Round Table (MDRT) gathering here for this exclusive life insurance sales organization's annual conference. Attendance at this year's meeting is the largest in MDRT history, with delegates representing 44 countries around the world, the the MDRT meeting is the comprehensive sales forum in the life insurance industry.

During the five-day meeting, more than 100 professional speakers were discussing subjects of vital concern to both the public and to those in the life insurance field. The program features experts in such areas as estate planning, taxes, small business operations and inflation.

The organization claims the top one to two percent of all insurance agents in the world. To qualify an agent must sell 1.5 million in coverage each to a minimum of 12
