"People's Candidate"

Launches Campaign Here

Evangeline Grant Redding, the people's candidate, kicked off her campaign in Charlotte for the governor's seat on July 6 and 7, with a get-acquainted session and a march to support the Wilmington 10 and Charlotte 3.

About 60 people came to

About 60 people came to Friday evening's meeting at Mayflower Memorial Baptist Church where Ms. Redding discussed the issues she will raise in the 1980 campaign.

"I came to see if you are for real," said a member of the audience who read about N.C.'s first black woman candidate for governor in The Charlotte Post.

"Most definitely, I AM for real," replied the 39-year old candidate from Tillery, N.C. She demonstrated her sincerity about being a people's candidate by joining the March for Justice and Unity on Saturday afternoon, marching several miles in the rain calling on Governor Jim Hunt to free the Wilmington 10

During her visit to Charlotte
Ms. Redding touched on a
wide variety of issues of interest to black and poor people,
including the Equal Rights
Amendment, collective barining rights for public emeducation, and

"You don't have to be brilliant or have money or a good education to be in this campaign," said Ms. Redding, a long-time civil rights activist.

"The key is participation." She stressed that lack of money doesn't mean you can't do something. "Success will be when the people get involv-

Questioned on the issues, Ms. Redding said she supports the ERA which would extend legal equality to women.

In education she favors increasing teachers' salaries and benefits to make teaching more attractive to well-quali-fied people. She also wants more state money for N.C.'s black universities.

When questioned about collective bargaining rights for public employees, Ms. Red-ding said she would like to see a change in the law because it would benefit poor people. The law that prohibits city governments from signing union agreements with their workers was a major issue in the recent Charlotte city workers strike.

"The white power structure wants to keep the law and that will be hard to break," said Ms. Redding.
A hundred dollars was re-

ceived in donations at the Friday meeting, according to supporter Dr. R. B. Phifer. "We need money, yes," he said. "But this is not a money thing; it's a people's campaign."

Several committees were established to organize Ms. Redding's campaign in the Charlotte area. A meeting is planned for the near future. For more information contact Earline Nelson at 334-6396.


