The Memorial United Presbyterian women will hold their annual Women's Day worship service 11:00 a.m., Sunday, Nov. 4 at Memorial United Presbyterian Church, 300 Beatties Ford Rd., Rev. Edward B. Newberry, pastor. The guest speaker will be Ms. Motalepula Chabaku. She was born in Johannesburg, South Africa and is a Mission Interpreter with the Synod of the Piedmont, United Presbyterian Church, USA. She is presently traveling over the United States speaking on Christianity.

Chabaku graduated from Lancaster, Pennsylvania Theological Seminary after three years of study in the Master of Divinity Program. She relinquished many positions in her home to study in the United States.

By decree of the white South African Government, Chabaku had to give up her South African citizenship.

Despite these government actions, Chabaku still holds prestigious positions; she is the Founder, member of the Black Women's Federation of South Africa and member of its Resource Panel (now outlawed in South Africa); member of the National Council of African Women, the National President of VOW (Voice of Women, a multiracial women's organization); committee member of Johannesburg Child Welfare Society; member of Johannesburg YWCA and many others.

Chabaku has traveled extensively through England, Scotland and Switzerland both on drama tuition and study tours for services available for wayward youths, experimental theatres and for religious drama.

She also travelled to many South African countries such as Kenya, Swaziland and Zimbabwe to conduct workshops on human-relations and attend religious conferences on non-denominational levels. The Memorial United Presbyterian women invite you to come enjoy the fellowship and hear the dynamic speaker, Motalepula Chabaku.

In July of 1977, Rev. Jeremiah Robinson became Mayfield's pastor. Even though his main concern was saving souls, one of his other concerns was building a new structure for the growing congregation.

Church members moved into the new site October 14. Dedication services will begin Sunday, Nov. 4 at 2:30 p.m. Rev. Griffin from Galilee Baptist Church will be the guest speaker.

Dedication services will continue Monday, Nov. 5 through Friday, Nov. 9 with different guest pastors speaking each night at 7:30 p.m. The last Dedication Service will be held Sunday, Nov. 11 at 2:30 p.m. with guest speaker Rev. Vest from Christ Episcopal Church.
