The Charlotte Area Fund, Inc. Monday began the second part of its 1980 Energy Crisis Assistance Program (ECAP).

An additional \$250,000 was earmarked for part two of the heat assistance program. Up to 1,250 low-income

families may receive a maximum of \$250. in fuel assistance.

Those among the 1,105 low-income families served under the first allocation will not be eligible for assistance under the se-

cond program. To eliminate long waiting periods the application process has changed, according to the Charlotte Area Fund officials.

Appointments are necessary to apply for assistance. Applicants must call 332-2341, 333-8113 or 372-3010 to schedule an appointment




