Low Income Families To Receive Fuel Assistance

The Charlotte Area Fund, Inc. Monday began the second part of its 1980 Energy Crisis Assistance Program (ECAP).

An additional \$250,000 was earmarked for part two of the heat assistance program.

Up to 1,250 low-income families may receive a maximum of \$250. in fuel assistance.

Those among the 1,105 low-income families served under the first allocation will not be eligible for assistance under the second program.

To eliminate long waiting periods the application process has changed, according to the Charlotte Area Fund officials.

Appointments are necessary to apply for assistance. Applicants must call 332-2341, 333-8113 or 372-3010 to schedule an appointment.

Charlotte Area Fund officials say applicants must bring documents to support their eligibility.

These documents (if appropriate) are pay stubs, letters from the Department of Social Services, Veteran's Administration, Social Security or company pension, retirement or dividends and an unemployment passbook.

Other items include a statement from the place where you get your pay check or government checks cashed or deposited, statement from employer, statement from

court for child support or alimony and a statement from the person in the household who pays the rent on a regular basis.

Applicants will also need the name of the fuel vendor or utility company, the account number and a copy of the most recent bill or statement of the amount owed.

Also needed are the social security number of the household bill payer, Medicaid card, and Section 8 letter of documentation of the amount of Section 8 subsidy.

Some applications under the first allocation were delayed by as long as three weeks when applicants did not bring the necessary documents with them, according to Charlotte Area Fund officials.

When applicants call, appointments will be made for the following locations during the listed hours.

Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m., appointments can be made for the West Boulevard Area Center, 3100 West Boulevard; the Westside Area Center at 1222 Oaklawn Avenue, or the Alexander Street Neighborhood Center at 910 N. Alexander Street.

The Central ECAP Office located at 213-15 East Morehead Street is open on weekdays from 2-8 p.m.

Special appointments will be arranged for severely handicapped persons unable to come in to these centers.

cabinet members of the Trilateral Commission. Bryant feels the Commission was instrumental in getting Carter elected.

Labor Relations is another area of interest for the 34-year old Bryant. While in Washington, D.C. he also worked for the Department of Human Resources, negotiating contracts between the government and its employees.

"I support government employees having contracts and collective bargaining rights," said Bryant. "It's especially important for blacks because it gives us something to fall back on." According to Bryant, a contract assures workers of their wages, job security and benefits.

"In North Carolina's anti-union climate many companies get away with things they wouldn't otherwise do," said Bryant. There is not enough em-
