

Filmmaker-Poet To Appear At Myers Park Baptist Church

Dr. Paul B. Newman, Chairman of the Humanities Division at Queens College here, will present a program of poetry and original films Sunday, April 27, at 4 p.m. The presentation - a part of the annual Hyacinth Artists Series at The Myers Park Baptist Church - will be held in the church's Great Hall and is open to the public without admission charge. The church is located at 1900 Queens Rd.

Newman has produced a number of colorful and personal motion pictures to dramatize his original poetry compositions, including "On The Coast" and "The Washington Trail" which he will feature in his presentation. Both are 16mm color and run about thirty minutes.

"On The Coast" features stunningly beautiful seacoast shots of the Carolinas from the Outer Banks to Cape Romain. The filmed images of the coastal area are accompanied by Newman's poetry and appropriate music. The poems describe experiences of coastal living.

"The Washington Trail," a Bicentennial film, moves along the same trail taken by General George Washington in his Southern Journey of 1791. It carries the viewer through North and South Carolina including scenes at the Orton Plantation, Big Landing (where Francis Marion received supplies during the American Revolution), Hopsewee Plantation (built by one of the signers of The Declaration of Independence), St. James Church and shots of the original King's Highway. The film includes original poems by Newman about General Washington.

To save the town's bets—and for a secret reason of his own—W.D. overcomes the town's old-line prejudice and persuades Palmerstown's segregated baseball teams to integrate, pitting the best from both teams against the visiting black team. But town leaders fear the town will soon learn why it was so necessary and withdraw their bets, thus forcing the cancellation of the game, in the conclusion of a two-part episode of "Palmerstown, U.S.A.," Thursday, April 17 at 8 p.m. on WBTB, Channel 3.

W.D.'s mysterious private motive for insisting the game go on at any cost, compels him to adopt questionable tactics to keep the townspeople from pulling their hard-earned money out of the game.

Newman is a graduate of the University of Chicago (B.S.), the University of Iowa (M.F.A.) and received his Ph.D. at the University of Chicago in 1958. He has been a faculty member at Queens College since 1963 having, earlier, served as a weather forecaster in the United States Army Air Force (USAAF), a lecturer at the University of Puerto Rico and an

Assistant Professor of English at Kansas State University.

His poetry has been published over 250 times in periodicals including Southern Poetry Review, Carolina Quarterly, Shenandoah, Massachusetts Review, Kansas Quarterly, Virginia Quarterly Review, Antioch Review and Literary Review.

He is the author of five published books: The Cheetah and the Foun-

tain, Dust of the Sun, The Ladder of Love, Paula and The Hose of the Saco.

In addition, he has won numerous poetry awards including the William Billings Fiske Award for Poetry from the University of Chicago (1955), the Roanoke-Chowan Award (1968), Crucible awards from Atlantic Christian College (1969, 1970) and the North Carolina Poetry Society Award

(1978). He also won an additional Roanoke-Chowan award in 1971 for his publication The Ladder of Love.

The Hyacinth series, in which Newman is appearing, is an extension of The Myers Park Baptist church's mission efforts, designed to provide high quality educational and cultural programs to the community throughout the year at no charge.
