immensely popular singer and actor, adds another dimension to his remarkable career when he recreates the most fabulous feats in aviation history in "The Higher We Fly," a special airing Sunday, June 15 at 7 p.m. on Channel Nine. Denver, a devout aviation buff, overcame his early fear of flying when his father, a World War II Air Force pilot, persisted in teaching him to fly a biplane. "Now," his father quips, "you can't keep him out of a plane."

Denver shares this love of flying by taking us on a journey through aviation history. He begins with a breathtaking flight over the Rocky Mountains in man's first air vehicle, a hot air balloon. After bouncing off the ground in a replica of the Kitty Hawk Flyer and barnstorming craggy mountain peaks, Denver is propelled into the jet age in an F-15 fighter jet. He also experiences a voyage into outer space in a simulated flight in the space shuttle. Finally, he peers into infinity for an imaginaative glimpse at what creatures might exist on other planets.

Denver sings "The Higher We Fly," which is based on a poem by John Gillespie, a fighter pilot who died shortly after he wrote the poem.
