\$20,000 Worth Of CB

Equipment Forfeited Here

Information supplied by Harold Bender, Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Western District of North Carolina, resulted in an undercover investigation in the Charlotte, North Carolina area by the Norfolk District Office of the Federal Communications Commission of the sale of illegal CB radio linear amplifiers and other modified CB radio

equipment. This investigation resulted in the criminal prosecution of Mr. Charles Groner of Groner Sales Company, Lusica, North Carolina. Mr. Groner entered a plea of guilty to the charge of selling an external radio frequency power amplifier, a violation of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. Some of the CB equipment had been modified to operate on U.S. Government frequencies used by the military and other agencies.

J.J. Freeman, Engineer in Charge of the FCC's Norfolk District office, said that the forfeited equipment, if sold, would have caused widespread interference to television reception and various other electronic home equipment such as hi-fi's, FM tuners, AM broadcast receivers and intercom systems. CB linears have even caused interference to telephones and pacemakers used by heart patients.

In addition to a cash fine, Groner forfeited all illegal CB radio equipment seized by the U.S. Marshalls. The forfeited equipment was valued at more than \$20,000.



Squaws Will Hold Biennial

Conclave In Charlotte

Squaws, Inc., a civic, cultural and social minded group of women from 16 focal points of the country, will hold their Biennial Conclave at the Radisson Hotel in Charlotte July 16 through July 20.

The group has chapters in Philadelphia, Detroit, Benton Harbor, Toledo, Cleveland, Charlotte, Durham, Dallas-Fort Worth, Washington, Houston, Atlanta, and Springfield. The founding chapter members are in Pittsburgh. The first name back in the early 50's was "The Midnighters." They jokingly referred to themselves as the Midnighters because family responsibilities and child rearing demanded them to meet late in the evenings.

As time passed and the members' children became older, the group decided to formally organize and the name Squaws was chosen. By early 1960 the Pittsburgh chapter had grown in number to 20.

Two chapters were added in Philadelphia in 1964 and Detroit in 1967. Charlotte was one of three, including Toledo and Cleveland to join in 1970. Squaw June Richards contacted Lillian Alexander of Charlotte in reference to the incorporation and the local group became the first Southern point in November, 1970. Detroit was the sponsoring chapter and Bettye McLaurin became the first local presi-

Today, Mrs. McLaurin is the National President, reelected for another term. She will preside over the


