Anderson's Daughter Campaigns Here

"People are looking for someone other than Jimmy Carter or Ronald Reagan," declared Eleanor Anderson-Kettler.

The eldest daughter of independent presidential candidate John Anderson, Mrs. Kettler appeared at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte recently to campaign for her father.

Reagan and Carter only, Reagan would win, she predicted. "Reagan doesn't have a presidential record to run on," whereas, "Carter's record is poor," she explained.

This presidential contest focuses more on the candidates as representatives of opposing party platforms than a choice between two leaders.

It's the republicans verses the Democrats more than an issue of Reagan against Carter, Mrs. Kettler emphasized.

The Washington, D.C. native added that two million voters signed a petition to include Anderson's name on the ballot, indicating public desire for an alternative candidate.

Mrs. Kettler pointed out Anderson "is assured a

place on the ballot in all 50 states."

Having 20 years experience in Congress to his credit, Anderson is now eligible for matching federal funds. This will enable him to wage a more aggressive campaign, according to his daughter.

Anderson will have a chance to express his views at the presidential debates he was invited to participate in recently by the League of Women Voters.
