Anderson's Daughter Campaigns Here

"People are looking for someone other than Jimmy Carter or Ronald Reagan, declared Eleanor a Anderson Kettler

The eldest daughter of independent presidential candidate John Anderson, Mrs. Kettler appeared at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte recently to campaign for her father.

Reagan and Carter only, Reagan would win, she predicted. "Reagan doesn't have a presidential record to run on," whereas, 'Carter's record is poor.' she explained.
